Position Summary: The Residential Peer Support Specialist will provide peer support services, serve as a client advocate, provide client with written and experiential information and resources to promote recovery as they seek treatment at The Women's Home. The Peer Support Specialist will perform a wide range of tasks which will assist clients in regaining control over their own lives and over their recovery process. They will also work within a multi-disciplinary treatment team to identify, support, assess and address consumer's barriers to achieving goals and objectives.

Duties:

A. General Duties

- 1. Provide individual peer support services to validate clients' experiences while engaging in residential treatment.
- 2. Conduct groups for clients to actively participate in their own recovery.
- 3. Continually monitors client progress and with the treatment team review and update the treatment plan as needed.
- 4. Promote personal growth and development with mental health and substance abuse issues.
- 5. Assist, teach, and support clients with activities of daily living, vocational skills, accessing housing, maintaining financial supports, and utilizing buses and other transportation in the community.
- 6. Provide side-by-side support, coaching and encouragement to help clients socialize and carry out leisure time activities on evenings, weekends, and holidays.
- 7. Provide training, information and referral to clients and interested parties regarding special needs and procedures for accessing relevant community resources.
- 8. Monitor clients who may decline active services who represent a potential danger to self or others to ensure referral for emergency psychiatric or other crisis intervention services as needed.
- 9. Complete all paperwork, reports, and charting and in an organized manner by established deadlines.

B. Other Duties/ Requirements:

- 1. Participate in weekly supervision
- 2. Attend and participate in all scheduled team meetings.

- 3. Participate actively in on-going professional growth and development;
- 4. Maintain appropriate professional behavior at all times.
- 5. Maintain a pattern of regular work hours. Including some evenings and weekends.
- 6. Must be able to transport clients in the community.
- 7. Other duties as assigned

Required Qualifications:

- Associates Degree or equivalent; Bachelor's Degree preferred. Degree in social work, psychology or related field- preferred.
- Have lived experience
- 3-5 years working with individuals impacted by substance use disorders and mental illness
- Have experience in accessing and utilizing mental health and substance use disorder services
- Must demonstrate leadership and advocacy skills, and have a strong dedication to recovery.
- Credentialed as a State Certified Peer Specialist or be eligible to become certified within six months.
- Valid Texas driver's license
- Reliable transportation
- Able to drive a van and pass driving test
- Able to work flexible hours including evenings and weekends.
